John Reischman and the Jaybirds

John Reischman is widely acknowledged as one of the premier mandolinists of his generation, a tone-master and lyrical composer known in the '80s and '90s for his music with the *Good Ol' Persons* and *Tony Rice Unit*. Since moving to Vancouver, BC, he's released 6 albums with *John Reischman & the Jaybirds*, 3 as a solo artist, 3 more with guitarist *John Miller*, and collaborations with a number of others. John formed the *Jaybirds* in 2001, and the original lineup remains intact: the Bay Area's **Jim Nunally** on guitar; Spokane's **Greg Spatz** on fiddle; Chilliwack, BC's **Trisha Gagnon** on acoustic bass; and Nanaimo, BC's **Nick Hornbuckle** on banjo.
